## US liaison office established

Inez Tenenbaum, chairman of the US Consumer Product Safety Commission, announced on Monday the establishment of its liaison office in the US embassy in Beijing.

Tenenbaum met with Sun Dawei, deputy director of the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine, and introduced the two attaches who will work closely with the Chinese government on the commission's behalf.

The two sides reviewed progress in the past year and discussed future joint activities, including the next summit scheduled for Washington in October.

## 10-year ban on forest logging

Heilongjiang province has banned logging in the country's largest forest for 10 years to protect the natural environment and reduce China's carbon dioxide emissions.

Logging will be forbidden in the Greater and Lesser Hinggan Mountains until 2020 in accordance with the mountains' forest protection program issued recently by the National Development and Reform Commission and State Forestry Administration.
